¹ Elizabeth Johnson a.k.a Letitia Johnston was a daughter of, Rebecca Scanlon Johnston in the next household. Michael Green [sic] and Letitia Johnson [sic] had a daughter Bridget born 13 April and baptized at St. Patrick's on 6 May 1855 which suggests Michael may be a brother of Bernard whose mother was Bridget McGornan. See: *Several Johnston Families at Rawdon, QC* and for footnote 11.

² Rebecca Scanlon, Mrs. Francis Johnston, died at Montreal died November 4, 1879 at 91 years, according to an obituary in the Montreal Star and was buried in Côte des Neiges (RC) Cemetery in a plot owned by a son-in-law. It is likely that Rebecca's husband was Protestant and late in life she returned to the Catholic faith.

⁴ The names are reversed on the census. Jacques [sic James] son of Barnard [sic] Green and Alice Donnelly was 3 weeks when baptized at St-Jacques de l'Achigan, November 21 1830.

⁵ The 1837 register for St. Patrick's Church at Rawdon identifies the baptism of Hugh son of Bernard Green and Allyse Donald [sic] on August 21 and born "the day before yesterday". The sponsors were Michael and Bridgette Green [sic] "who with the father cannot sign".

⁶ Michael Green was born and baptized May 29 and 30, 1842, St. Patrick's Church, Rawdon

⁷ Marie Sara [sic Mary Sarah] Green was baptized 6 January 1832 at two weeks at St-Jacques.

⁸ Mary Green was baptized 19 September 1833 and was born on the 12th at St-Jacques.

⁹ This must be an error as both girls seem to have the same name.

The spelling of names are as written, the enumerator was Francophone and used French spellings for Margaret and Edward. His French spelling was weak, as he misspells Catherine which is the same in English or French and used phonetic spelling to reproduce the name as spoken in Irish brogue. Bas Canada = Lower Canada
