File 119 10 Jan 1842 Regarding purchase of additional church land

Meeting at Parsonage – R. H. Bourne, Mr. John Eveleigh & Mr. George Constable Church Wardens, Mr., Hugh Torney & Mr. George Copping, jun. Vestrymen re the parsonage

Resolved to present the following statement concerning the land "The proposed land adjoining the property now belonging to the Church, included in the separate parcel and belonging to three several individuals they consider would form a valuable addition to the Church property and afford a very desirable and eligible spot for the site of a parsonage.

The three acres next adjoining the present church property, and separated from it by a line for a public road, valued at 5 pounds per acres they consider high but on account of their situation, and the desirableness of preventing

them form being occupied in any way which would incommode the church, they think that it would be better to purchase them even at that price, if they cannot be obtained for less.

The ten acres next adjoining, partly cleared and under pasture, valued at £2.10 per acre and the 5 acres adjoining them, under wood and valued at £3 per acres they consider valuable as affording a Suitable Situation for a parsonage convenient to water, and the prices of the said two lots last mentioned they think are moderate and reasonable. They beg leave therefore respectfully to recommend the proposition to the favorable consideration of the Commissioners
