1880 US Census: Weston, Windsor County, Vermont

Andrew Kirkwood other 19 CAN Farm Laborer

He was living with the Timothy Holt family. Other means he was other than in a direct relationship to Mr. Holt.

1900 US Census: Village of Bennington, Bennington County, Vermont

The family gave their year of immigration as 1867. William and Mary were said to be married 37 years [sic] actually 44 years. William parents were said to be born in Canada [sic] and Mary's were born in Ireland.
